



- 9. Have you and your family 1)made a WRITTEN family emergency plan, including the phone numbers of emergency contacts; 2) identified your evacuation route; and 3) prepared an EMERGENCY KIT?
- 10. Do you think it's important to learn how to swim?

From your printed out **Situation Hurricane** game kit, pull out the Practice SITUATION and POWER KNOWLEDGE cards, and ask for volunteers to read the **purple NOT PREP READY SITUATION** with great expression. Demonstrate with this card:

DANGER! You got separated from your family, did not have your cell phone, and did not have your written emergency contact numbers with you. (Verse 4b)

Invite two volunteers to perform the GET PREP READY VERSE 4b. Here it is:

To avoid a crisis, you have to make a PLAN.
Know what to do and UNDERSTAND.
Use your HEAD.
Know your ROUTE.
And STAY TOGETHER if you have to GET OUT!

Do the same with the other GET PREP Ready rap verses!



GET PREP READY DO'S AND DON'TS

In this video, we'll once again re-visit the As-If world of our feature film, Never Say Whatever, Especially in a Hurricane.

There are two key scenes that focus on the Do's and Don'ts of hurricane preparation.

Let's start with this one:

In which Fretta screams that a hurricane is coming. Landshark says, "WHATEVER," and you get the strong feeling that this is definitely NOT an attitude you should have when a hurricane is coming!



How Prep-Ready are YOU right now?

Recall that this work is about AVOIDING DISASTERS, because in Disasters, people die.

Think/Pair/Share: What do you think should be included in a Hurricane Disaster Avoidance Plan? Assuming you've been tracking an oncoming storm, what do you need to KNOW and DO to stay safe?

Your family should pack a larger emergency kit, with supplies like those listed here on the FEMA Ready.gov


website. Be sure to download the FEMA app to receive alerts and get other potentially life-saving information.

TEST YOURSELF! HAVE YOU MASTERED THE POWER KNOWLEDGE FOR THIS DOMAIN?


There are several ways to determine if you've mastered the PREP-READY POWER KNOWLEDGE.
